### *From Our Rector*

Happy New Year one and all. I hope your holidays were full of joy. As we enter the new year I would like to give you a preview of the state of the parish. I won't go into the specifics I will in my report during the annual meeting, but generally the state of the parish is good.

We are smaller than we once were averaging a little over 45 or so on Sunday mornings. We seem to have a number of people who come regularly, volunteer and pledge yet don't come to services but close to once a month. Everyone who is attending seems to be active in some part of our common church ministry just are not liturgical participants every week. This is an indication of the demise of Christendom rather than something specific to our community. Church is but a portion of everyday life and less so then when Sundays were sacrosanct. We are gaining new members from time to time and we are adjusting to what we have and who we are at present.

We have achieved a balanced budget I believe. With the replenishment of our endowments through the generous bequests in the past year, we have been able to reduce our draw on trusts to sustainable levels across the board and fill in the balance of our day to day budget with your pledges. This is a huge achievement people. In less than two years we've gone from a budget which would have bankrupted the parish in ten years to one where we can be sustainable on an on-going basis. This has been done with fewer pledging units. There are some hurdles to overcome, particularly we are in arrears to the diocese still, and we will need to manage the cash flow throughout the year but these are well within our abilities to accomplish.

We have a youth group, yeah! Alas we have no real Sunday school, sob! In the past several months the participation in our youth group has come pretty much solely from our congregation and the friends of our young people. We will continue to reach out to the other parishes locally for efforts to collaborate. With the announced retirement of Rev. Kennedy at Trinity Nichols, the Episcopal Church in Trumbull continues to be in a state of flux. We will help where we can as always. We will probably need to look to ourselves for direction and leadership in any event.

That being said I should mention my additional positions since our last newsletter. I am as you know the Missional Priest at Grace Trumbull. This is an eight to ten hour a week commitment which doesn't impact the time and energy I provide to Christ Church. I have set up hours there at Grace which don't impact my time here and things seem to be working smoothly. I have also taken on the role of Chaplain to the Long Hill Fire Department. This is a volunteer position and is part of my community outreach ministry. As we are part of the community at large living a life in Christ may attract participation.

The early church gained members more through how the disciples lived and died than any particular scriptures or stories. People learned who Jesus was from people they wanted to hang out with or took inspiration from. The scriptures came afterwards once people showed an interest in belonging to the community. That was the pre-Christendom way of evangelizing. People chose to come into a community of faith it was not something they were obligated to do, in fact the powers that be were hostile. Today while there is not really any "war of Christmas or Christians" there is no longer accommodation from society to attend worship. We are sustained by people who want to be here rather than who are supposed to be here. This is a good thing.

We have a vision for who we are and where we are going as outlined in our strategic plan. The decisions we will be making in the coming year and years will reflect who we are and how we want to enact God's ministry in our community. Most of you participated in a real way to the plan through your input. As the diocese is re-imagined through the TREC-CT process those who know where they are going will fare better, I believe, than those who let the winds of change propel them.

Our ministries and fellowship is vital. We just completed a vibrant Advent series and will be starting a Lenten series before the next newsletter comes your way. We have ideas for on-going youth events, for example we've opened the safe in the office and perhaps the youth could produce a time capsule to place in the safe to be opened in thirty years. Our physical plant is being repaired slowly but surely and more may happen this coming Spring. The spirit of this place is vital and alive. We have variety in our liturgies from our periodic Rite 1 8 a.m. service to our monthly Youth Service. We will be including healing into our services in the coming months to make up for the loss of Deacon Diane's ministry on Sunday mornings. I would appreciate your feedback concerning our efforts and your patience until we "get it right".

So many times "borrowing from Peter to pay Paul". Bills get pushed out or not paid for extended periods during the summer. So for one of our New Year resolutions, please keep our pledges up to date or pay them forward if you are going to be away.

I am going to make every effort in 2016 to summarize all our previous work on completing the second floor so it can at least be used for activities and save it from a lifetime of being a closet, and a messy one at that. Maybe we will have to do it in pieces, like eating an elephant. And the first bite would be to put in a fire exit which is part of the deck we have planned. But we have lots of maintenance to do to our church as well so think about what's important to you and talk to your favorite vestry member. Give us your voice.

We have accomplished some great things this year. Through some very generous gifts we have some extra money for maintenance-but not daily expenses. We restored our beautiful stained glass windows.
